- Currently living in Nassau, Suffolk, Brooklyn, Queens or Staten Island
- Can attend the ceremony (medals are presented only at the ceremony; they are not mailed)

After having been canceled last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Shootout for Soldiers 24-hour lacrosse tournament was back in action on Thursday, July 22-23, 9:00 AM-9:00 AM at the Town of Oyster Bay Field of Dreams, 5619 Old Sunrise Highway in Massapequa. There are twenty-four one-hour games in a row and a running score is kept between the two teams, Stars and Stripes. Participating teams play in a one-hour slot during the event and the event is open to men's and women's teams of all ages. The mission of the Shootout is to use lacrosse as a platform to support American veterans and foster good community relations. Long Island Chapter 202 of the Air Force Association is proud and grateful to be one of the local charity beneficiaries that share in a portion of the net proceeds (after expenses) raised from this event. Shootout for Soldiers is a registered 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization. Shootout for Soldiers has raised over \$4.5M since its inception, running 50 events in 15 different cities nationwide with more than 25,000 unique participants. This year, Long Island raised \$179,230, a record amount for our veterans!

LIAFA held its 33<sup>rd</sup> Vietnam medal ceremony at 5 PM on July 22 during the Shootout. **Twenty Vietnam** veterans were presented with Vietnam 50th Anniversary Commemorative Medals and Certificates of Appreciation. #### Long Island Metropolitan Lacrosse Foundation 9/11 Ceremony

As LIAFA was hosting our Vietnam Vets Medal Ceremony described above, down the road our friends at the Long Island Metropolitan Lacrosse Foundation (LIMLF), which has faithfully supported LIAFA for many years through its Shootout for Soldiers event, was holding the 9/11 Memorial Rededication Ceremony at Farmingdale State University.

Soon after the tragic events of 9/11, members of LIMLF realized that among the lost were twenty-nine lacrosse players from our area. To honor those players, LIMLF, with assistance from Farmingdale State University and many others, created the Long Island 9/11 Lacrosse Memorial. The memorial was dedicated on September 9, 2005, with family members of those who were lost in attendance.

Now with the generosity of the lacrosse community and its friends, LIMLF raised more money to add to the memorial three individuals (John Swaine, John Vigiano and Joseph Vigiano) who perished in the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attacks and five first responders (Robert L. Burns, Kevin C. Miller, Kevin D. Nuckel, Matt Perlungher and Michael Romano) who have since died of 9/11-related illnesses.

LIMLF also updated the memorial with new lighting and benches, memorial bricks, benches and a bolt from the World Trade Center. John Danowski, the Head Coach at Duke, was the guest speaker. #### <u>Iraq/Afghanistan Veterans Monument for Eisenhower Park</u>

A fund-raising effort is currently underway to fund the construction and installation of a monument to honor the veterans of Desert Storm (1990-1991), the war in Afghanistan (2001-2021) and the war in Iraq (2003-2011). It will be installed near the Vietnam veterans monument in Veterans Plaza in Eisenhower Park in East Meadow. Public defense attorneys are rarely trained to adequately represent veterans who suffer from the invisible wounds of war or to translate the combat experience of their clients to explain resulting criminal behavior. This program provides training, support and legal assistance to promote trauma-informed effective representation of veterans and service members. The Veteran Defense Program (VDP) is a project of the New York State Defenders Association (NYSDA), a statewide nonprofit organization working to improve the quality and scope of publicly-supported legal representation for

### Did you know . . .

Martha McSally, former Congresswoman and Senator from Arizona, served in the U.S. Air Force from 1988 to 2010. She is the first American woman to fly in combat (1995 in an A-10 Warthog as part of Operation Southern Watch enforcing the no-fly zone over southern Iraq) as well as the first to command a fighter squadron (in July 2004 at the 354th Fighter Squadron at Davis-Monthan AFB in Arizona, which subsequently deployed to Afghanistan). She retired from the Air Force with the rank of Colonel.

Seventeen hundred and sixty PlayStation 3 gaming consoles were a vital part of an Air Force computer network called the "Condor Cluster." At the time this network was the DOD's fastest computer and the world's 33<sup>rd</sup> largest supercomputer. It was built at the Air Force Research Laboratory and was designed for radar enhancement, pattern recognition, satellite imagery processing, and artificial intelligence research for current and future Air Force projects and operations. Compared to one made with more traditional components, the network consumed far less energy and was also much less expensive. Unfortunately, in 2010 Sony pushed a firmware update that revoked the device's ability to install alternate operating systems, which is what the Air Force PlayStations were running on (Linux). The Air Force didn't need the firmware update nor could Sony force it on those devices, but if one of the PlayStations were to go down, it would be the end of the cluster since any new or refurbished replacement devices would lack the ability to run Linux. This development also spelled the end of several similar academic networks.

James (Jimmy) Stewart ("It's A Wonderful Life" actor) was the first major American movie star to enlist in the U.S. Army in February 1941 (he initially tried to enlist in 1940 but was rejected for being underweight). Stewart went in as a Private, but because he was already an accomplished pilot, the Army granted his request for a commission, sent him through flight and bombardier schools and made him an instructor. He went on to command the 703<sup>rd</sup> Bomb Squadron in England and began flying combat missions in B-24 Liberators. He eventually became Chief of Staff of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Combat Wing, 2<sup>nd</sup> Air Division of the 8th Air Force, flew 20 combat missions and ended the war as a Colonel. He remained in the Air Force Reserves and was promoted to Brigadier General in 1959. Stewart deployed one last

time to Vietnam as an observer on B-52s during Operation Arc Light in 1966. Upon reaching the age limit of 60, he retired on May 31, 1968. In 1985, President Ronald Reagan promoted him to Major General from the retired rolls and awarded him the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Stewart was one of the founding members of the Air Force Association in 1946.
