Honoring U.S. Veterans—Operation Overlord

On June 6, Suffolk County Executive Steven Bellone honored six veterans at the H. Lee Dennison Building in Hauppauge for their service in World War II.

Two of the veterans served in the invasion of Normandy on D-Day, June 6, 1944. D-Day marked the beginning of Operation Overlord, the codename for the Battle of Normandy in France and the opening of a third front on Nazi-occupied Europe, putting the final nail in the coffin of Hitler's empire and marking the beginning of the end for the German war machine.

Sgt. David George of St. James and Pvt. Frank Agoglia of Deer Park were presented with the French Jubilee of Liberty Medal by Suffolk County Executive Steven Bellone, Suffolk County Director of Veterans Services Thomas Ronayne and Long Island Air Force Association President Fred Di Fabio. A certificate accompanies the medal.

These medals were minted at the request of the President of the Regional Council of Normandy, France and approved to be presented to veterans attending the 50th Anniversary Ceremony of D-Day on June 6, 1994 at Pointe du Hoc in Normandy, France.

Eligible veterans included all who served in the Normandy campaign from June 6 to August 31, 1944, and who were part of the land forces, off-shore personnel, or airmen flying overhead. Most veterans could not attend the ceremony in France; therefore, the French government authorized special veteran groups in the USA to present the Jubilee of Liberty Medals in ceremonies on their behalf. The Long Island Air Force Association was one of those groups.

The AFA has presented over 500 Jubilee of Liberty Medals to our Long Island veterans since 1994 and these were the last of the medals to be presented, on the 78th anniversary of D-Day.

Iraq/Afghanistan Veterans Monument for Eisenhower Park

All groups are

confidential and anonymous. Weekly group meetings are held in Amityville (Mondays), Bay Shore, Yaphank, Sag Harbor (Tuesdays), East Patchogue, Riverhead, Patchogue (Wednesdays), and Mount Sinai (Thursdays). Snacks and light refreshments are served at all meetings. They also provide services to student veterans at numerous Long Island college campuses and monthly community outreach in Sachem, Huntington Station, and Patchogue. Veterans Defense Program

Justice-involved veterans often do not have the funds to hire an attorney and are represented by public defenders. Public defense attorneys are rarely trained to adequately represent veterans who suffer from the invisible wounds of war or to translate the combat experience of their clients to explain resulting criminal behavior. This program provides training, support and legal assistance to promote trauma-informed effective representation of veterans and service members. The Veteran Defense Program (VDP) is a project of the New York State Defenders Association (NYSDA), a statewide nonprofit organization working to improve the quality and scope of publicly-supported legal representation for people who cannot afford a lawyer. The U.S. Air Force has the U.S. military's only field-duty military working horses. While the Army does have some horses, they are used only for ceremonial purposes. For years, the Air Force horses were employed by the Security Forces to patrol remote and otherwise inaccessible parts of its air bases. Currently, the only remaining mounted horse patrol unit is assigned to the 30th Security Force Squadron at

Vandenberg Air Force Base in California. This unit patrols over 150 square miles of land around the base as well as the 36 miles of coastline owned by Vandenberg.
